



SCHOOL NEWS

- ★ THIRD PARTY FOOD DELIVERIES For the safety and security of the school we would like to remind everyone Pinnacle High School can only accept food deliveries from a parent or guardian. Third party food delivery services like UberEats, Postmates, etc. cannot deliver food to students while in school. If food is delivered we cannot allow the student to have the delivery until after school. Unclaimed food is thrown out at the end of each day.
- ★ ATTENDANCE Regular attendance is the key to student success. Students should remain out of school only when absolutely necessary, such as in the event of an illness. Students

- ★ SCHOOL LUNCH FOR THE 22/23 SCHOOL YEAR The Nutrition & Wellness
 Department has returned to charging students for their meals based on their free, reduced, and paid meal application status during the 2022-2023 SY. The 2022-2023 Free & Reduced Meal Application will be available starting Monday, July 11, 2022 for parents to complete. Online meal applications can be completed at EZMealApp.com; this paperless option is encouraged because online applications can be processed within 24 hours of their submission. Paper meal applications will be available in school front offices or can be printed from the Nutrition & Wellness website to be submitted to the department. All families are encouraged to apply because meal applications can be used for additional benefits aside from meals, such as:
 - Funding for student programs and services
 - Reduced registration fees for AP, SAT, and/or ACT tests
 - Free or discounted fees to participate in most sports
 - Discounted rates on fees associated with applying for college
 - Eligibility for discounted rates on internet services

It is extremely important for families to complete and submit the 22-23 SY meal application in order to avoid potential negative account balance charges.

- ★ GOOD NEIGHBOR POLICY Pinnacle would like to remind all stakeholders that we practice a "good neighbor policy". We ask that everyone be mindful of where you can and cannot park in the surrounding neighborhoods. Parking in these areas during the day, or during drop-off and pick up can cause a safety concern if too many cars are parked or moving in areas that have high foot traffic.
- ★ NO PARKING ZONE The City of Phoenix has made a request that no students are to park in the city dog park or skatepark South of the School. Per the City of Phoenix Park Manager, vehicles will now be towed at the owner's expense.
- ★ DROP OFF & U-TURNS PHS has received a number of calls from concerned parents about dropping off students in the desert North of PHS with the students then jaywalking in traffic to school. Also we have noticed more u-turns on Mayo Blvd. Please do not drop off in the desert or u-turn on Mayo Blvd. In addition please do not drop off or pick up students along Black Mountain Blvd.

- ★ MEDICATION AND EMERGENCY CARDS *Reminder* <u>Update your emergency card</u> <u>information electronically</u> as soon as possible so that we may continue to communicate successfully throughout the year.
- **★** DRUG-FREE CAMPUS. Pinnacle High School is a DRUG-FREE CAMPUS. All prescription and nonprescription/over-the-counter meds must be kept in the nurse's office stored in their original container.
- ★ To better familiarize yourself with the dangers associated with underage "vaping," please read "5 Things to Know About Teens Using E-Cigarettes for Marijuana" from Your Teen for Parents.
- ★ HEALTH OFFICE PICK UP When your student is calling to be picked up from school, please advise them to proceed to the Health Office for assessment to determine if going home appears appropriate for them. The nurse will always call if there is any question in terms of going home. By following this policy a more consistent procedure is developed for the rest of their school years at Pinnacle. Please remember to pick up the Medical Administration Waivers in the Health Office so that we can provide Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Tums, or other approved meds to your students to keep them in school as much as possible.

Your student can pick them up in our office to bring home and return. Please, if you have medical concerns or questions regarding our procedures, call Mr. Morales at 602-449-4003.

★ OVER THE COUNTER OR PRESCRIBED MEDICATIONS As a reminder students are not allowed to carry any over the counter or prescribed medications on campus. They are to be given to the Health Office with a signed permission form. Your student is subject to possible suspension if caught. This is for the safety of all our students. SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL HEALTH

Taking Care of our Children's Wellbeing

Parents spend an average of 37 hours a week worrying about their children. No doubt these worries come from the best of intentions. But in fact, teaching them that the world is dangerous is bad for their health, happiness, and success.

If I believe that the world is dangerous, it will affect the way I see many other parts of my life, relationships, and work. I will be more suspicious of other people's motives, for example, and less likely to do things that might put me or my loved ones in harm's way, such as going out at night.

As much as we hope the dangerous-world belief will help our kids, the evidence indicates that it does exactly the opposite. you likely suffer a lot more when you are always looking for danger and avoiding risk.

Kids with this outlook are more often sad, more likely to be depressed, and less satisfied with their lives. They also tend to dislike their jobs and perform worse than their more positive counterparts. Teaching your kids that the world is dangerous can also make them less tolerant of others. Additionally, a general state of fear can actually make a person less likely to take threats seriously and undermine precautionary behavior.

To break this pattern, parents—and anyone who interacts with children—should instead work to cultivate a sense of safety. Here are three rules to help you get started.

Heal thyself

Many parents pass on their anxiety to their children.

Being a kid in America has never been safer. Since 1935, the number of childhood deaths between the ages of 1 and 4 fell from 450 to 30 per 100,000. It has fallen by nearly half just since 1990, and the decreases in other age groups are similarly impressive.

Be specific and proportional

Social conflict is unavoidable, and making them fear it as an existential threat renders them less resilient.

Counteract negativity

Be specific about the kind behaviors we witness every day, and ways that the world is safer than in the past.

In the words of the Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu. "Through Love, one has no fear," If you want to give your children a rule to live by, this one is a much safer bet. -Arthur C. Brooks

★ ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) EXAMS

Dear Parents of AP Students:

PVUSD aims to make the Advanced Placement (AP) exams as accessible as possible for all students who wish to attend college. Therefore, our district has elected to utilize program funding through the College Credit by Examination Incentive Program and through a Title-IV A grant to reduce the costs of all AP tests this year.

- The cost of the exam will be \$62.00 per exam.
 - A **\$35 savings** due to PVSchools using College Credit by Examination funding to support the reduction of test fees
- The cost of the AP Capstone Seminar and AP Capstone Research will be \$110.00
- The cost of the exam for students on **Free/Reduced lunch** will be **\$0 per exam**.
 - To apply for Free/Reduced Lunch, visit <u>ezmealapp.com</u>. Call (602) 449-2274 to ask for status or a copy of the already approved letter.
- The registration window for all AP students is **September 27th November 1st.**
 - The deadline to register for the AP Exam is November 1st, 2022.
 - All Exams ordered after November 1st will be assessed a \$40 late fee.
 - A canceled exam after November 1st, 2022 will incur a \$40 deduction from the student's reimbursement. (*see tax credit)

REGISTRATION STEPS:

- **STEP ONE:** Join your **MyAP College Board** classroom with the Join Code your AP teacher gave you. If already completed, **move to Step Two**.
- **STEP TWO:** Continue your AP Registration by going onto *Total Registration www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/030377.*
- **STEP THREE: Payment -** After the *Total Registration* process is completed, exam fees must be paid. Options for payment:
 - Tax Credit
 - Non Tax Credit.

Deadline for payment in full - November 1st, 2022

Exam fees must be paid in full at the Pinnacle bookstore or through the school's website.


*There are two options when paying test fees, payment by Tax Credit and payment by Non-Tax Credit.

AP Testing Tax Credit - You can pay AP testing fees as a Tax Credit. AP Testing Fees paid by Tax Credits are NON REFUNDABLE. Please be sure you have completed your AP Test registration on the College Board before paying for your tests. Please be sure to print your receipt (if paying on the Webstore) for your Taxes. *Please note: If you pay AP testing as Tax Credit you will forfeit any possibility for a refund due to a circumstance such as a canceled exam.

<u>AP Testing NON Tax Credit</u> - AP Testing fees can be paid as a NON-Tax Credit fee. Please be sure to complete your AP Test registration on the College Board before paying for AP Tests. Canceled tests will be subject to a College Board assessed fee of \$40.
